HPC is concerned that the only option under consideration for increasing the number of non-selective secondary education places appears to be the expansion of Mascalls Academy.

This Statement of Common Ground only considers the need arising from the proposed development around Paddock Wood. However, it should also be recognised that the Local Plan allocates a significant amount of residential development in the east of the Borough, particularly around Hawkhurst and Cranbrook. This housing development will also result in an increased demand for secondary school places, which does not appear to have been taken into account.

In Hawkhurst, around 100 houses are currently undergoing construction, with outline permission agreed for another 100 or so homes.

With the closure of High Weald Academy in Cranbrook, children from Hawkhurst lost their local non-selective secondary school. The bus journey from Hawkhurst to Mascalls is an hour, with the school bus leaving the centre of Hawkhurst at 7am. The return bus leaves Mascalls just after the end of the school day, meaning that children cannot access afterschool clubs.

As part of the Local Plan process, surely this is an opportunity to review the approach to secondary education in the east of the Borough. The CEO of Leigh Academy Trust has confirmed that there is space for a new school on the High Weald site in Cranbrook and that Leigh Academy Trust would be prepared to run it as a satellite of Mascalls. HPC strongly supports this approach.

A new school at Cranbrook would not only reduce the need for Hawkhurst children to have to travel so far to school but would also reduce the pressure on the other nonselective secondary schools freeing up spaces for pupils local to them.

HPC recognises that the possibility of a satellite of Mascalls at Cranbrook was not an option when this planning was undertaken. However, now that it is, it should be given detailed consideration.
