The effect of this plan is to almost double the size of Paddock. With this in mind, it is not unreasonable to expect that the demand for all of the sports offered in Paddock Wood may double.

Paddock Wood Bowls Club could not cater for these numbers with our current green or clubhouse facilities. We would need to have a green that is the same width, but 20 metres longer and a clubhouse double the size of our current buildings, which measure a total of 24m x 7m.

Our existing plot is approximately 42m x 50m. There would not be space on our existing plot for the facilities that we would need. Our estimate is that we would need a plot of approximately 65m x 57m. On our existing site, this could be accommodated by extending the playing area out towards the pond and relocating the clubhouse, which is currently on the east side, to the west side. If space for a single-story clubhouse proved to be an issue, then it could be possible to have a two-storey clubhouse built on a smaller footprint.

In that period the club could contribute c£50,000 towards the cost of the improvements. In addition to any grants that could be secured.

As an additional benefit, a larger clubhouse could allow enough space to also offer short mat bowls to the community.

Paddock Wood Town Council had put a lot of thought into their proposal for a sports hub at Eastlands. Tunbridge Wells Borough Council, in their infinite wisdom appears to have ruled that out with very little thought. The information provided appears to indicate that the area is unsuitable for sports facilities based on flood risk, although it does appear that TWBC think that it is fine to build houses on that land!

In my experience councils get far better value out of developers if they are asked to build something rather than just provide funds. With one developer already offering to build a brand new 6-lane athletics track, it is surely comfortably within reach to get a combination of developers to build all of the facilities necessary for a sports hub.
