Many thanks for the email.

My main concern is the allocation of a secondary school on a site that has always flooded. Tudeley Brook, which runs alongside the allocation, more often than not runs at a higher level than the surrounding fields and in extreme weather overflows at the

junction of Eastlands Lane and Tudeley Brook.

The attached photo ...214 was taken a few days ago showing Tudeley Brook clearly running well above the waterlogged field. The other photo ...749 was taken in 2022 showing the allocated site under water. Both photos have the location embedded as they were taken on my phone.

The site has flooded for MANY years. I also attach the EA plan showing the extent of flooding back in 1963! The proposed allocation is identified as flood zone 2 which is clearly optimistic.

If the allocation remains, I trust that you will be giving every child pairs of wellies and speedos!

In my view, the site is a pretty dumb place to put such an allocation.

Update: Consultation extended to midnight Friday 12 April 2024 *- Public Consultation on Tunbridge Wells Borough Council's Response to the Inspector's Initial Findings Letter on the Examination of the New Local Plan

Following the Local Plan examination hearing sessions (March to July 2022) for the Tunbridge Wells Submission Local Plan, the Inspector wrote to the Borough Council setting out his <u>initial findings</u> in November 2022.

Having considered the initial findings, the Council is proposing that the examination of the Local Plan be progressed through a **Revised Development Strategy to the Tunbridge Wells Submission Local Plan (SLP)**, to include the following changes:

- Proposed removal of the strategic policy STR/SS 3: The Strategy for Tudeley Village from the Local Plan.
- Revision of the strategic policy STR/SS 1: The Strategy for Paddock Wood and land at east Capel, including a reduction in
 the amount of residential housing growth by approximately 1,000 dwellings, with all housing being on Flood Zone 1 and
 employment land on Flood Zone 2, along with a reduction of employment provision, and reconfigured sport and recreation
 provision and secondary school education provision (as set out at Appendix D of the Development Strategy Topic Paper
 Addendum).
- At Hawkhurst it is proposed to revise site allocation policy number AL/HA 5: Land to the north of Birchfield Grove, to
 include housing, and land safeguarded for primary school expansion (in accordance with a planning committee resolution
 on application reference 22/02664/HYBRID).
- Also at Hawkhurst, the Council proposes the removal of site allocation policy number AL/HA 8: Limes Grove (March's Field) from the Local Plan. This site was proposed for employment use in the Submission Local Plan.
- Progression of a 10 year housing land supply position including the requirement for an immediate review of the plan.

Following the extended deadline of Friday 12 April 2024, any further representations received in response to the consultation will also be taken into account and passed on to the Inspector.
